

## **Parking**

### **Convention Center Parking**

Onsite private vehicle parking is available at the San Diego Convention Center's 1,950-vehicle underground garage located below the building. Enter the parking garage on Harbor Drive between First Ave. and Fifth Ave.

**The cost is \$10 per vehicle per day for Convention Center events and \$10 for events held at PETCO Park. \*Rates subject to change.**

Payment is due upon entry and there are no in-and-out privileges.

No overnight or RV parking is permitted.

### **Downtown San Diego Parking**

Directly across the street from the Center, at the corner of Harbor and 8th Ave., is a 2,000 space parking structure. Offsite parking is also available at numerous nearby parking lots and garages in Downtown San Diego; many are within walking distance of the San Diego Convention Center. Parking lots and garages are individually owned and operated; prices vary by location. Metered street parking is available in some areas. Parking meters are enforced Monday through Saturday, from 8:00-6 pm, unless otherwise posted. Metered spots are free on Sunday and designated holidays. Meters accept nickels, dimes, quarters, and prepaid electronic debit cards.

The best forms of transportation to and from the San Diego Airport are shuttles and taxis. Taxis and shuttles are abundant and easily accessible from the San Diego Convention Center, airport, major hotels, and downtown locations. Taxi fares from the airport to the San Diego Convention Center range from **\$12 - \$15**, and many shuttle services are offered (see below).

### **Shuttle Services**

#### **Airport Terminal Shuttle**

The Red Bus provides complimentary wheelchair-accessible transportation between the Airport's terminals. Buses run at intervals not to exceed 10 minutes. Designated Red Bus stops are located curbside at all three terminals. For additional information call Lindbergh Parking, Inc. at (619) 291-1508.

## General Shuttle Services

Shuttle vans and buses are a popular and convenient transportation option. Shuttle service is available at the Transportation Plazas across from Terminals 1 and 2, and curbside at the Commuter Terminal. From Terminal 1 cross the skybridge, and take either the escalators or the elevators to street level. From Terminal 2, cross the Terminal 2 skybridge and take either the escalators or the elevators to street level, or use the pedestrian crosswalk located outside the Terminal 2 Baggage Claim Area to access the Transportation Plaza. A Transportation Coordinator will place you with the first available shuttle, unless you specify a particular shuttle company.

The guide below lists shuttle companies frequently used by travelers. Call directly or use the Web links to find the shuttle that best suits your needs. Policies, services, and rates are subject to change and may vary based on destination, passengers, and number of stops. Each shuttle company is required by the airport to have vehicles that can accommodate passengers with disabilities. ## Taxi Services

Many companies provide taxi service at San Diego International Airport. If you need a taxi, simply follow the signs leading to the Transportation Plazas. A Transportation Coordinator will place you with the first available taxi unless you specify a particular taxi company. The approximate one-way fare between the airport and downtown hotels is \$12-\$15.

## Bus

Public transit is available to and from the Airport and downtown San Diego on [Flyer Route No. 992](#), stopping between Terminals 1 and 2 and the Commuter Terminal. The 10-minute bus service connects with Trolley, Coaster and Amtrak stations and is wheelchair accessible. It costs approximately \$2.25 (exact change). Visit [http://www.sdcommute.com/Rider\\_Information/Routes/992.asp](http://www.sdcommute.com/Rider_Information/Routes/992.asp) to view the bus schedule.

The Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) public bus is available to the downtown area for a fare of \$2.25. The fare for a senior or disabled rider is \$1. Exact fares are required as the drivers cannot make change. Buses depart the airport for downtown approximately every 10 to 15 minutes. Buses travel downtown between 6:00 am and midnight. Day Tripper Passes are also available for \$5 per day, \$9 for two days, \$12 for three days, and \$15 for four days. For more information, please contact San Diego Transit at (800) 266-6883. The North County Coaster runs 43 miles along the coast with station stops in downtown San Diego, Old Town, Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad, and Oceanside.

## Trolleys

The San Diego Trolley **does not** stop at the Airport. However, it does reach many neighborhoods and areas with popular attractions and landmarks, such as Old Town, Downtown, Mission Valley and Fashion Valley. Rider Information is available to help you use the trolley with ease and comfort. Check out the trolley routes and timing online at [www.sdcommute.com](http://www.sdcommute.com).

Trolley fares are based on trip distance and are good for travel for two hours from the time of purchase and may be used to travel until the expiration time stamped on the ticket. Round-trip fares for the San Diego Trolley are generally from \$2.50 to \$6. The fare for senior and disabled riders is \$1. Day Tripper Passes are also available for \$5 per day, \$9 for two days, \$12 for three days, and \$15 for four days. For more information, please contact San Diego Transit at (800) 266-6883.

**Consider purchasing a \$5.00 Regional Day Pass which is good for all trolley trips and most bus routes for one operating day.**

## **Amtrak and Coaster**

Amtrak Intercity and Coaster commuter trains link communities and travelers from as far away as Los Angeles and Orange Counties to downtown San Diego and coastal North County and, includes stops in Old Town, Sorrento Valley, Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad and Oceanside.

Travelers headed to and from San Diego International Airport can connect with Amtrak's Pacific Surfliner and the Coaster at Amtrak's Santa Fe Depot train station downtown by using Metropolitan Transit System Flyer Route No. 992 every 10 minutes between 5:00 a.m. and 12:50 a.m.

Amtrak operates seven days a week, 365 days per year, with twelve round trips. Tickets may be purchased at the Amtrak station.

The Coaster operates Monday-Saturday. There is no Sunday service and no service on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving or Christmas Day.
